### Richie Schobel



In November 2019 Richie Schobel was diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer. He was told he had less than six months to live if he didn't have chemotherapy. If he did have chemotherapy, he might have a year. He knew that he had to get right with the Lord, so he started praying daily. He stopped by Jordan Lumber one day and spoke with Joe Davenport. He shared his diagnosis with Joe and also that he wanted to get right with the Lord. Joe invited him to come to church at WMBC, and Richie did. The first time he came to WMBC they offered to do a group prayer for Richie. They laid hands on him and prayed for his healing and recovery. He had never experienced anything like that. He was welcomed at WMBC with open arms. Richie has gone through 4 years of extensive chemotherapy and a little radiation as well. To say that it was tough is putting it mildly but here we are 4 1/2 years later.

Approximately 6 months ago Richie went in for a CT scan and blood work to see how the tumors on his pancreas and liver were responding to the treatments, and if any cancer could be detected in his blood. They found NOTHING! No tumors on his pancreas and no tumors on his liver. The blood work came back clear as well. No signs of cancer. It was a miracle! Pastor Tom was among one of the first people he contacted. Joy, Richie's wife, and his daughter Jesse and son Mark have also been there for Richie from the beginning and he is extremely grateful for all of them.

Richie completely understands that only God can perform a miracle like this. He gives God all the praise and glory. He is aware that the cancer can return, but he is grateful to God for the health he has right now. He said, "a positive attitude was important". He didn't want to just give up. He had to fight. It was a tough battle but he put his trust in God. He is very grateful for his WMBC family as well. His favorite Scripture is from **Psalm 23: 4 "Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I will fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and your staff, they comfort me."**

## Vacation Bible School (VBS)

This year the WMBC Vacation Bible School program held the last week of June was titled SCUBA. Over 40 children from surrounding towns and visitors from as far away as Florida shared in this week-long adventure all about diving deep into a relationship with God and discovering He can be a friend. Each day children learned about God through music, hands-on activities, Bible stories, theme-related snacks and outdoor games. The children traveled in small groups with a crew leader to guide them to various activity stations where they learned more about the daily themes and working together in a small group. Bible stories about Elijah, Jonah, Jesus and His disciples, the apostle Paul, and Lydia of Macedonia were introduced. Each story illustrated the daily theme: God is a friend who is real, God is a friend who loves, God is a friend who can be trusted, God is a friend forever and God is a friend for everyone.

Throughout the week there were lots of opportunities to help children connect the daily lessons with real life. Jonah may have thought the peoples of Nineveh, known as the worst terrorists of their day, didn't deserve God's mercy, but God loves all people. His mercy extends to all who admit their faults and ask Him to forgive them and help them change. The children also learned that it was because Jesus, God's one and only begotten son, died on the cross that the whole world has a chance to be God's forever friend. When Jesus died for the sins of the world once and for all, He gave those who believe in Him a chance to be forgiven. When Jesus came back from the dead, kids learned that His death wasn't the end. It was the beginning of a friendship with God that will last forever into eternity. When the apostle Paul sailed to new lands beyond Judea, teaching about Jesus's life, death and resurrection, the children learned that it doesn't matter what country you live in, what language you speak or what color your skin is, no one should be left out of God's loving friendship.

The week-long adventure came to a climax on Sunday with a video-style slide show and a special presentation by the children. After the service, there was a potluck cookout for all the children and their families as well as the WMBC congregation. Each year we are so gratified to see how many volunteers join in the months-long preparation for this special opportunity for learning and fellowship. The week flew by with great enthusiasm and camaraderie, children formed new friendships and an awareness that God can be a forever friend. From the teen crew leaders to the young parents and retirees in all aspects of the program, we thank everyone who pitched in to make the program a success.
