How is God Working in Your Life?

A little bit of background;

In 2017 I lost my only child to brain cancer. His name was Eugene Goss Pray IV (D.J.), he was 37 years old. He loved the outdoors and he loved his 3 children.

It's been nearly seven years since DJ passed. Most days I cope pretty well, but sometimes I struggle. I seem to have a hard time when I hear others complaining about their children. The choices they make or don't make, in life and in love. Recently I attended a bible study and one of the ladies was struggling with their own grown child's choice of not following the Lord. I had been struggling, missing DJ and I thought quietly, "at least you have a child". I know, that seems unkind but that is just where my head was at that day. I was hurting inside and didn't know what to do. I had prayed but couldn't find relief.

Later that afternoon I watched a recent episode of a popular Christian series. Near the end one of the main characters died. It was heartbreaking. Her fiancé asked Jesus to "fix it". He knew that Jesus could. He was upset, bitter, sad, angry and sobbing. Jesus looked at him, and said "it's not her time". He could fix her, but it wasn't the will of the Father. Jesus felt his pain, He felt it deep inside. You could see the pain in His eyes.

And that is what I needed at that moment. To know that Jesus knows my pain. He feels my pain. He feels and knows everyone's pain. He experiences our pain with us. I cried and prayed and thanked Jesus for showing me that just when I needed it most. He is a "Good, Good Father".

Matthew 5:4 "Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted."

And for those who struggle with adult children who have wandered I offer this prayer; Heavenly Father, I pray for Your mercy and grace for those who are lost, hurting, hopeless, and needy all around the world. I ask for You to compel those souls who are without You as Savior and Lord to hear Your voice as You seek and save those who need You most. I pray this in Jesus precious name. Amen

Insights from Women's Wednesday Morning Bible Study

Wednesday morning during the school year, Betsy Dubois teaches the Women's Bible Study. Last fall 2023 we studied prayer. The study guide was titled "When You Pray". During this study we covered six prayers from the Bible introduced on video by six different women Bible teachers who lead Bible studies around the country. Betsy guides discussions and helps us think about some things we might have otherwise overlooked. This particular study has stirred up thoughts, and I believe, through the work of the Holy Spirit, has helped me see myself more clearly.

One of the prayers we studied was Psalm 139. I had been drawn to that Psalm over the years and have often been comforted by it. As we looked more closely and I read it over again and again, I began to understand some more of the reasons why it had that impact on me.

Psalm 139 starts out. v1 "Lord, you have searched me and know me. v2 You understand my thoughts from afar... v4 Before a word is on my tongue you know all about it..". "This Psalm goes on to describe so many ways that God is ever present and present everywhere. He knows our past, present, and future. He has always been and always will be. He is infinite. Knowing this gives me reassurance that God is in control and there is nothing beyond His control.

He makes no mistakes. v9 "... if I take the wings of morning and dwell in the utmost parts of the sea, v10 even there shall your hand lead me and your right hand shall hold me..." These verses, give me comfort and a sense of protection and guidance. v13 "... For you did form my inward parts. You did knit me together in my mother's womb. v14 I will praise you because I have been carefully and wondrously made... "v16 "Your eyes saw me when I was formless. All my ways were written in your book and planned before a single one of them began".

"This shows me that I am not here by chance. Nothing is a surprise to God. He knows every mistake I have made and will ever make, and he still loves me. He still has a good plan for me to give me hope and the future (paraphrase) Jeremiah 29:11.

Psalm 139 v18 "... When I wake up, I am still with you..." I realize in all this I am not alone and never will be alone. I realize I have value because I am a child of God. I don't have to go searching to find myself. I don't have to go prove myself or prove my worth. What a discovery!

How much time has been wasted? How many lives have been spent by people trying to find themselves or prove themselves not really knowing what they were looking for? How many people get caught up in competition and rivalry trying to prove they are better than someone else? How many people in families, tribes, kingdoms, and nations have spent time boasting, bullying, and trying to be recognized, trying to prove themselves better than others?

I admit, I have been caught up in all this competition and striving for something elusive. Could it be identity? I am even more confident now that above all else my identity is that I am a child of God. My identity is not the sum of my accomplishments, my career, my possessions or even the family I was born into.

If you have followed me in this journey to understanding, please join me in this closing prayer.

O Lord, you know each one of us. You have known us before we were born. We have trusted your son, Jesus, who has taken our sins with him to the cross. He has washed us clean by the blood He shed. When we repented, O God, you forgave us. We are adopted into your family as your children. Heavenly Father, you have a good plan for us. You give us value. None of us is here by mistake. Please help us to stop wasting time. Please help us to know you better so we can do your will and fulfill your plans for each one of us. Please help us to see your priorities and pursue them in your ways and in your timing. We praise you and thank you for your unconditional love, your grace, your long suffering and patience with us. O Lord, please help us to be more like you and please help us to develop these same qualities in our own lives. We ask this in Jesus name, Amen.
